Please bring your OWHA official roster form, and provide required documentation for pick-up players

ROSTERS TO BE VERIFIED AND PICK-UP PLAYER FORMS, TRAVEL PERMITS, AND ALL OTHER DOCUMENTATION TO BE HANDED IN AT YOUR FIRST GAME

Please ensure you have read this year's 2014-2015 OWHA Handbook Constitution, Bylaws, Rules and Regulations in regards to pick up players. It is your responsibility as a manager – coach to have a very clear understanding of this rule. OWHA Change of Participant Form – For any OWHA player new to your roster that has been added, we will require a copy of this as well and please BE SURE this paperwork is filled in correctly with dates and signatures and that you have chosen the correct OWHA Form, "For Sanctioned Tournaments".

MANDATORY NECK GUARDS Mouth guards are recommended but not mandatory.

Tournament Playing Rules 2015

Cambridge roadrunners Girls' Hockey Association Tournament Rules

1. OWHA rules shall apply

2. All games will consist of 10-10-12 minute stop time periods, except Bantam A, Midget BB, and Intermediate A will be 12-12-12, with no flood between periods.

I. All teams must be available to play 30 minutes prior to a scheduled game start time.

II. Tournament Officials reserve the right to eliminate floods to keep the schedule running on time.

III. HOME teams wear White, AWAY Teams wear Dark, in the event of a jersey color conflict, the AWAY team must change their jerseys.

IV. There will be a TWO (2) minute warm up prior to each game. The TWO (2)minutes begins immediately after the ice re-surfacer doors close. All games will begin immediately upon completion of the warm up.

V. Running time will be enforced only after the first period has ended and when one team is ahead by FIVE (5) goals. Stop time will resume again once the goal difference falls below FIVE (5) again.

VI. One THIRTY (30) second time-out per team will be allowed in both semi-final and final games only (this includes any overtime play).

VII. Girls will shake hands upon completion of the game. Gloves must be worn during the hand shake.

- **3.** A maximum of 20 players (goalies included) will be allowed on each team.
- 4. A player can only play for one designated team during the tournament.

5. The OWHA minimum suspension guidelines will be strictly enforced. All suspensions will be enforced according to the OWHA 2014-2015 Handbook.

6. Team will be awarded TWO (2) points for a win, ONE (1) point for a tie and ZERO (0) points for a loss. Standings / Scores will be posted at the Tournament Headquarters in the Hespeler Arena and on-line http://cambridgeroadrunners.com/Tournaments/1194/21st Annual roadrunner Tournament/

7. Standings after the round robin will be calculated on the basis of the points awarded as per the rules, however, in the event of a tie, the following tie breaker shall be used as per OWHA rules:

I. Number of wins


II. Record against other tied teams (not applicable if three way tie)

III. Highest percentage of (Goals For/(Goals For + Goals Against))

Calculated as;

- IV. Fewest Goals Allowed
- V. Most goals scored
- VI. Goals For Goals Against
- VII. Fewest penalty minutes

VIII. Most periods won



IX. Winner of a single coin toss – to be supervised by a CRRGHA Tournament Official

8. All Championship games will be played to a winner with the OT & Shootout format, while Semi-final & Quarter-final games will go directly to a Shootout. Prior to the start of any Championship, Semi-final or Quarter-final games, each coach must designate their first 8 shooters (S1 – S8) on the game sheet should a shootout be required to decide a winner, there will be no flood for OT or Shootouts.

I. In the event of a tie at the end of regulation play, a five minute sudden victory overtime will be played 4 on 4. All player changes must be made 'on the fly'; no player changes will be allowed during stoppages of play. Penalties incurred during the 5 minute overtime must be served as usual. ONE (1) penalty would result in 4 on 3 play, while TWO (2) penalties would result in 5 on 3 play.

II. In the event that a player receives a penalty during the 5-minute overtime, that player will not be eligible to participate in the shootout, the coach will be allowed to designate a replacement if that player was S1- S8.

III. If the game is still undecided, a best of 3-player shootout will follow, (S1, S2, S3). Teams will not change ends for the shootout, and the Visiting Team will shoot first, alternating from team to team. After each team has taken their first three (3) shots, if still tied, a 'sudden VICTORY' shootout will proceed starting with S4, until a winner has been decided. A shooter will not be allowed to shoot for the second time until after all players on the team with the shortest roster have taken a shot.

9. Coaching staff will select the **THEIR team's GAME** MVP for each game, players are to line up on the Blue's after handshake and Ref's will hand out.

10. All decisions by Tournament Officials are final.


