This past summer, four Cambridge Rivulette players had the opportunity to participate at Provincial Team Selection Camps.

Aly McLeod attended the U16 Camp. Olivia Hilton, Lauren Martin, and Leah Herrfort attended the U18 Final Selection camp. Players selected from the U18 camp will represent Ontario at the 2017 National Women's Under-18 Championship in Quebec City that begins November 1st.

Both the U16 and U18 camps were for the top 80 players in the province at the respective age groups.


